

Review and Outlook

- Investors' appetite for short term fixed income securities continue to rise as higher quoted prices hauled down yields on securities. Average yield on the Nigerian Treasury Bills dipped further by 98bps in the secondary market, closing the month at 2.70% down from 3.68% at the end of March.
- Significant declines were recorded across all tenures and maturities, as
 even primary market auction rates continued its downward movement during the month. Average valuation yield on Commercial Papers likewise fell
 by 88bps to close the month at 5.64 % of from the respersive figure of 6.52%.
- Decline in yield is attributed to high system liquidity and lack of investors' appetite for other risky assets owing to the current global economy situation.
 Inflation figures for the month of April printed at 12.26%, up from 12.20% reported for the previous month. The market is currently sporting a negative real return of 7.63% on 90 Day NTB.


Review and Outlook

- As system liquidity increases, leaving more idle investible funds in the economy, and investors' appetite for risky assets decline; yields on government bonds continue moving southwards due to increased buy interest in Federal Government Bonds.
- Average yield on FGN Bonds dipped by 172bps during the month, closing at 10.19%, from 11.91% as at 31 March, 2020. Quoted prices on all bonds rose during the month as no bond recorded yield appreciation. Substantial yield depreciations were recorded across the yield curve, as yields on the 23 March, 2025 and 22 January, 2026 maturities fell by 375bps and 307bps respectively.
- Rising inflation rate in the economy worsened investors real return to a negative 7.13%, as headline inflation rate for the month of April 2020 printed at 12.26%, from 12.20% in March 2020.






