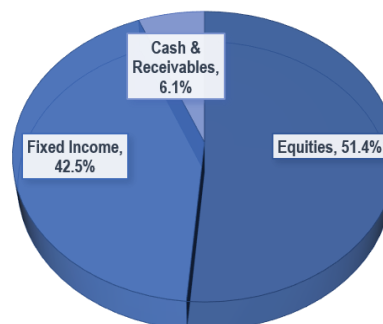
Review and Outlook

- The NSE All Share Index (ASI) gained 3.8% in February 2019, closing at 31,718.70 from 30,557.20 at the start of the month. The increase in the ASI was led by the Insurance and Oil & Gas sectors which gained 8.92% and 6.55% respectively. The insurance sector rally was driven by AxaMansard (+15.79%, while Oando and Seplat gained 19.19% and 15.7% respectively.
- As mentioned in our last update, we think the equities market hit its floor at EQUITY INDICES IN 2015 29,336.8 on 9 Jan 2019. A near term potential catalyst would be the coming round of full year earnings releases and corporate actions which are currently being released. We may see a delayed return of investors to the equities market, as investors look out for signs of market supportive policies in a government regime that is otherwise regarded as pro state ownership.

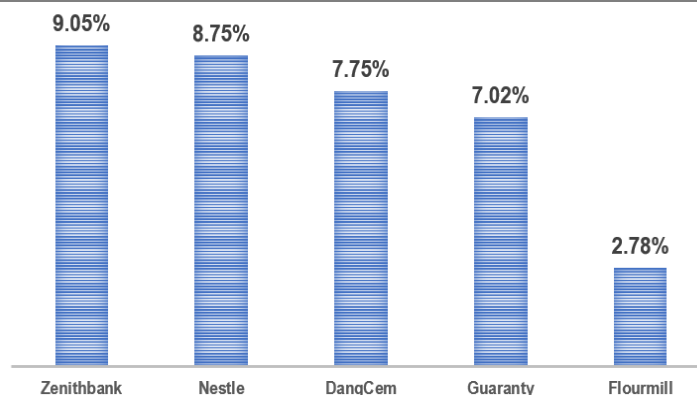

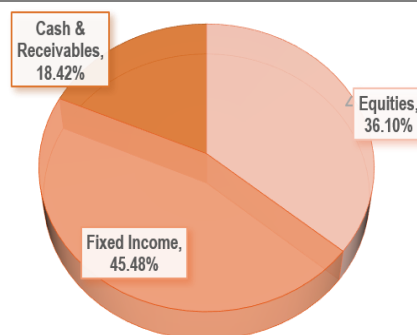
Review and Outlook

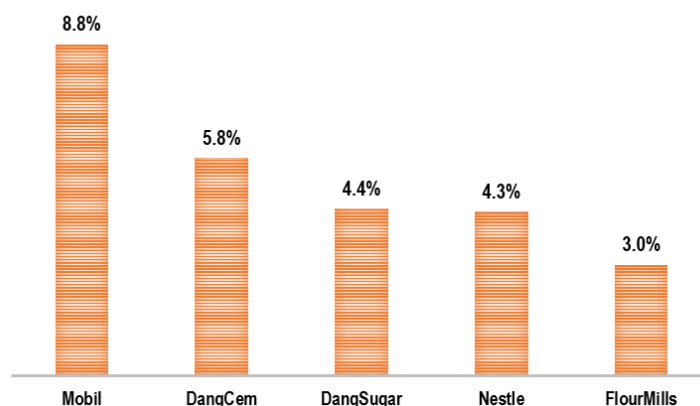

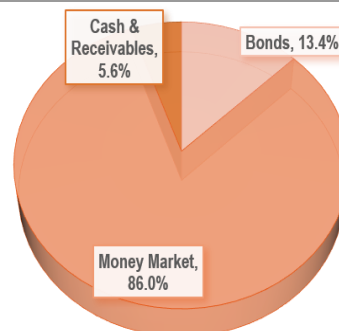
Review and Outlook

- Yields on treasury bills dropped by 178bps on average over the month from 14.52% as at 31 January 2019 to 12.74% as at 28 February. The decrease was more pronounced in the 1M and 9M yields which fell by 259bps and 185bps respectively. Corporate Bonds yielded 15.97% on 28 Feb, vs. 14.84% yield on FGN Bonds with similar maturities on the same day.
- The February 2019 position represents the second pull back in T-Bill yields after 5 consecutive months of increase from an average of 11.96% in July. Inflation figures for January 2019 were released during the month, showing a decline in YoY headline inflation to 11.37% from 11.44% in December 2018. This was driven by a 5bps decline in food inflation to 13.51%, as core inflation rose by 14bps to 9.91%. We think yields will start to contract in the short term with the return of institutional capital to the market.

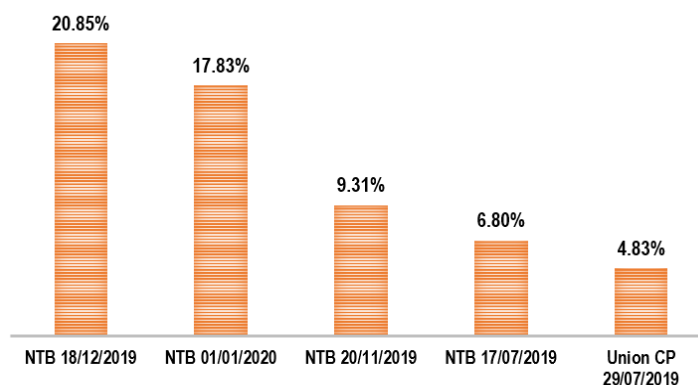

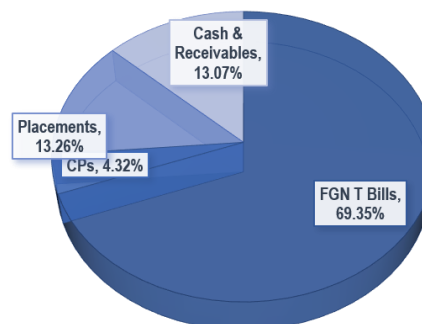
Review and Outlook

- Yields on treasury bills dropped by 178bps on average over the month from 14.52% as at 31 January 2019 to 12.74% as at 28 February. The decrease was more pronounced in the 1M and 9M yields which fell by 259bps and 185bps respectively. 7—196 day Commercial Papers yielded 12.07% on 28 Feb, vs. 10.84% yield on T-Bills with similar maturities on the same day.
- The February 2018 position represents the second pull back in T-Bill yields after 5 consecutive months of increase from an average of 11.96% in July. Inflation figures for January 2019 were released during the month, showing a decline in YoY headline inflation to 11.37% from 11.44% in December 2018. This was driven by a 5bps decline in food inflation to 13.51%, as core inflation rose by 14bps to 9.91%. We think yields will start to contract in the short term with the return of institutional capital to the market.

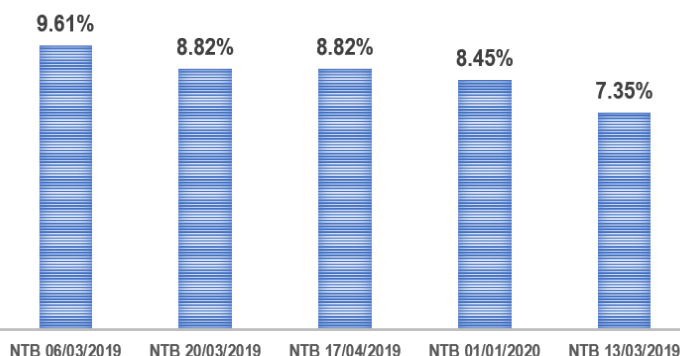
