- The NSE All Share Index lost 0.69% in August 2019, closing at 27,525.81 points from 27,718.26 at the start of the month. The decrease in the ASI was led by the oil & gas and insurance sectors, which declined by 12.16% and 7.68% respectively. The oil & gas sector decline was driven by Seplat (-18.84%) and Forte Oil (-16.28%), while Continental Re (-24.08%) and NEM Insurance (-11.63%) led the insurance sector decline.
- 5.1 billion shares worth N62.0bn were traded in August 2019, up from 4.7 billion shares worth N56.0bn traded in July 2019. The NSE ASI performance in August was less bearish than the MSCI emerging and frontier markets indices, which lost 2.7% and 1.6% respectively over the month. The downward trend in the NSE ASI seems to persist, as the 12 month chart shows the index recording lower consecutive support levels.




