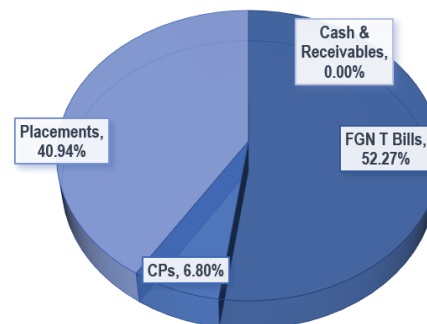
Review and Outlook

- Yields on treasury bills dipped by 249bps on average over the month from 7.31% as at 30 November 2019 to 4.82% as at 31 December. Significant declines were recorded across all maturities with 6M yield losing the most (368bps) and 12M yield losing the least (187bps). Commercial Papers yielded 6.72% on 31 December, vs. 4.96% yield on T-Bills with similar maturities on the same day.
- The decline in yields can still be attributed to the CBN's restriction of non-bank financial institutions from partaking in Open Market Operation (OMO) Bills. Inflation figures for November 2019 were released during the month, showing an increase in YoY headline inflation to 11.85% from 11.61% in October, driven by both food and core inflation. The market is currently sporting a negative real return of 5.69% on 12M NTB.

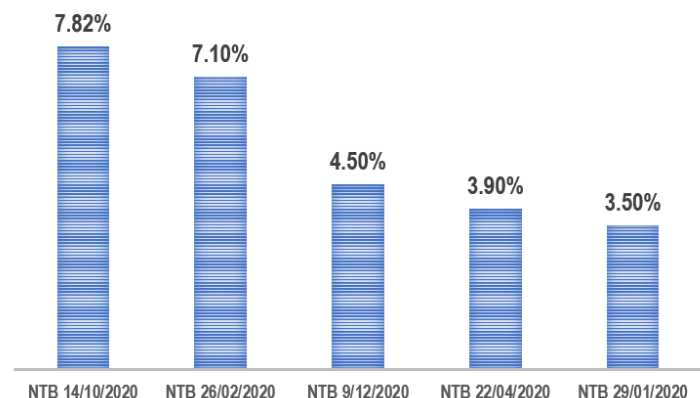

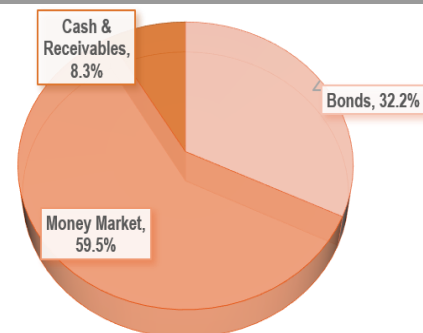
Review and Outlook

- Yields on FGN Bonds dipped by 121bps on average over the month from 12.35% as at 30 November 2019 to 11.14% as at 31 December. Greater declines were seen in the short end of the curve with 1-5yr maturities losing 193bps on average while 6-10yr maturities lost 97bps. Corporate bonds yielded 11.70% on 31 December, vs. 10.61% yield on FGN bonds with similar maturities on the same day.
- The decline in yields can still be attributed to the CBN's restriction of non-bank financial institutions from partaking in Open Market Operation (OMO) Bills. Inflation figures for November 2019 were released during the month, showing an increase in YoY headline inflation to 11.85% from 11.61% in October, driven by both food and core inflation. Investors need to go 9 years out on the yield curve to get positive real returns on bonds.

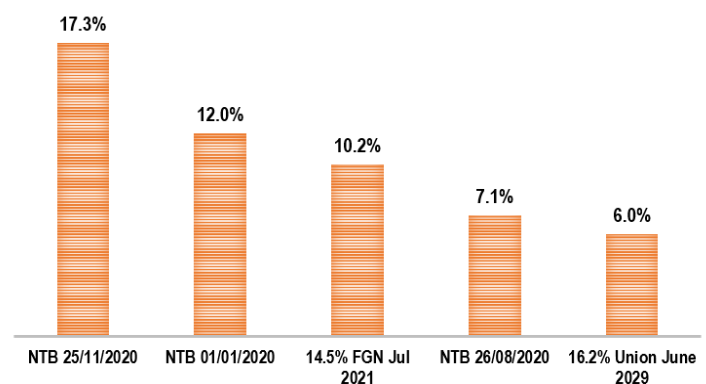

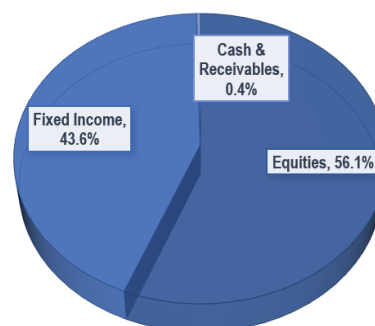
Review and Outlook

- The NSE All Share Index inched down by 50bps in December 2019, closing at 26,842.07 points from 27,002.15 at the start of the month. The decrease in the ASI was led by the MTN (-12.5%), banking sector (-1.19%), and industrials (-0.67%). The banking sector decrease was driven by Union Bank (-14.29%) and GTB (-2.46), while DangCem (-0.56%) led the consumer sector decline.
- 5.55 billion shares worth N62.73bn were traded in December 2019, down from 6.98 billion shares worth N86.47bn traded in November 2019. The NSE ASI performance in December underperformed the MSCI emerging and frontier markets indices which gained 5.45% and 3.85% respectively. We think the market recorded some profit taking on short term rallies given uncertainty about long term market catalysts.

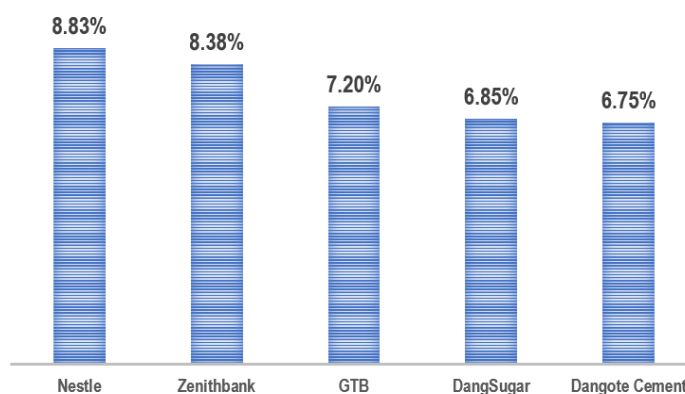

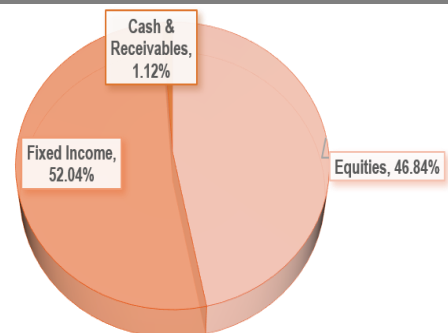

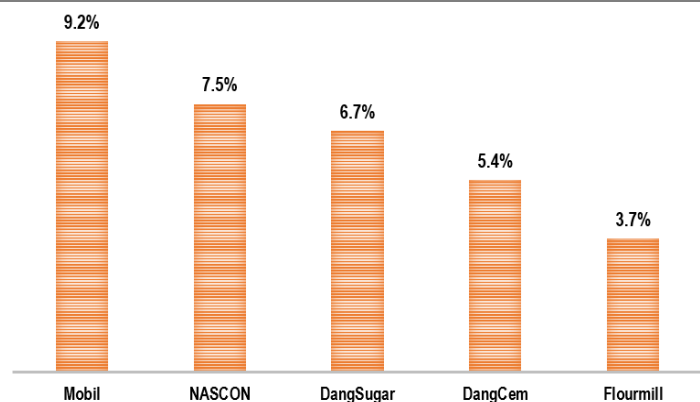
