
### MARKET COMMENTARY


Sell pressure in the Nigerian Treasury Bills secondary market pulled quoted prices lower, as average yield rose in the market. Average yield closed at 6.21% at the end of the month, a 37bps increase from previous month's 5.84%. The appreciation was due to the introductions of the 24 August 2023 bill and 9 May 2024 bill which closed at 6.08% and 7.78% respectively.

Average NTB Primary Market Auction stop rate was 5.74%, compared to the previous month of 5.87%, as the stop rate for 91day, 182 days and 364 day closed at 2.87%, 4.37% and 6.23% respectively. A total of N187.11Bn was offered across the tenor while N187.11Bn was allotted.

Nigeria's inflation rate elevated further in May 2023, rising to 22.41% from 22.22% recorded in the previous month, which represents the fifth consecutive increase in the headline inflation rate.

The Central Bank of Nigeria raised its benchmark interest rate by another 50 bps to 18.5% in a decision announced on May 24th 2023, as widely expected. It marks the third consecutive rate hike so far this year, bringing borrowing costs to their highest since the monetary policy rate was adopted in 2006. The decision was driven by continued upside risks to the inflationary outlook and the further acceleration of inflation through April.



Sell pressure in the Nigerian Treasury Bills secondary market pulled quoted prices lower, as average yield rose in the market. Average yield closed at 6.21% at the end of the month, a 37bps increase from previous month's 5.84%. The appreciation was due to the introductions of the 24 August 2023 bill and 9 May 2024 bill which closed at 6.08% and 7.78% respectively.
